


GLOBAL FLOWS AND MOBILISATIONS

- ✓ Up to six million immigrants living in Spain at the beginning of the economic crisis
- A significant percentage of that number came from Spain's former colonies in Latin America.
- ✓ With the onset of the economic crisis, many of those economic migrants were forced to emigrate again once the work dried up.
- With them, thousands of young Spaniards also fled in search of work.







What is "Spain"?

To what extent can we answer the question What is Spain?

The nation is an "imagined political community" (Anderson 1983)

But what about it's "extraordinary emotive capacities"? (2005, 92)



National identity is [...] about the experience of belonging to such a community, being steeped in its traditions, its rituals and its characteristic modes of discourse. This sense of national identity is not of course dependent on actually living within the geopolitical space of the nation, as the émigré experience confirms. Thus some diasporic communities uprooted from the specific geo-political space of the nation or the homeland, still share a common sense of belonging, despite – or even because of – their transnational dispersal. On the one hand community, on the other, diaspora. ... [All nations] are thus forged in the tension between unity and disunity, between home and homelessness.

Las dos Españas

A national division that splits Spain in two

Nationalist "conservative" Spain Vs. A "republican" liberal Spain

A narrative that defined the civil war and dictatorship period

A division that was seemingly taken care of through negotiated pacts of "silence" and "forgetting"



FRAGMENTED BIPOLARISM: End of the two-party system

- Where does this leave las dos Españas today?
- Perhaps the division is no longer between the left and the right but between two different conceptualisations of what Spain is, an "old Spain" and a "new Spain".


A division about where Spain finds itself now and where it should be headed into the future.



2015 General Elections







No Confidence Vote – 1 June, 2018

- Launched by Socialist leader Pedro Sánchez
- Mariano Rajoy was ousted
- 180 votes in favor vs. 169 against (one abstention)
- Motion supported by Podemos and Basque and Catalan nationalists



PP Elects a New Leader

- Pablo Casado 37 Years Old
- Has been described as a
- Neo-conservative
- Monarchist
- Catholic,
- Pro-life
- Atlanticist
- Anti "gender ideology"
- In favour of neutralising historical memory movements
- In favour of outlawing political parties that support independence from Spain



PSOE & PODEMOS AGREEMENT 11 Oct. 2018

- Increases the minimum salary from 735,90 euros to 900 euros a month in 2019
- Guarantees pension increases in line with inflation
- Provisions for equality in Maternity and Paternity leave
- Free education between 0-3 years
- Remove co-payment for medicines starting with pensioners
- Control rent increases increase contracts from 3 years to 5 years
- 40% increase to people with disabilities / dependencies

Tax increases to people who earn more than 130,000 euros a year and to estate taxes of more than 10 million euros to pay for these policies.



The number of migrants arriving in the country this year has exceeded both Italy and Greece




VOX – The Rise of the Far Right?


- Set up in 2013

- Mobilising around anti-Islamic sentiment


POLLS: VOX would obtain 1,8% of the votes and one seat in parliament.





